



1 DAY LITCHFIELD

NATIONAL PARK & WATERFALLS

Allow us to show you one of our favourite places on earth, Litchfield National Park. Departing Darwin we make our way towards the world class Litchfield National Park, surrounded by thick pockets of tropical rainforest, it offers cool respite from the top end heat.

Stopping along the way you'll have an opportunity to jump on the famous Jumping Crocodile Cruise (optional extra) on the Adelaide River, alternatively visit the Fogg Dam Conservation Reserve and wetlands.

The traditional lands of the Limilngan-Wulna people (who are active in the reserve's management) are one of the most spectacular places to explore the diverse wildlife of the top end, home to numerous species of birds, turtles, water pythons and of course the iconic Crocodile.

We'll visit some incredible monolithic Magnetic Termite Mounds and then have an opportunity to cool off in one of Litchfield's beautiful natural plunge pools, like Buley Rockholes or Florence Falls. Visit a thundering waterfall like Wangi Falls and marvel at the sheer beauty carved out amongst the rocky escarpment. Fully relaxed and rejuvenated after a day in this stunning tropical national park, we make our way back to Darwin.

1 DAY PUDAKUL CULTURE

& KAKADU NATIONAL PARK

We leave tropical Darwin travelling through the rich floodplains towards the World Heritage-Listed Kakadu National Park. Our first stop of the day is within an hour from Darwin on an exclusive walking tour with the Traditional Owners at Pudakul Aboriginal Cultural Tours on Limilngan-Wulna land. You'll learn about bush tucker, bush medicine and be hands-on with rope typing. A cultural adventure not to be missed, this spectacular wetland area is alson home to numerous species of birds, turtles, water pythons and of course the iconic crocodile.

Continuing into the Kakadu National Park we

learn more about the rich Aboriginal culture and history of this special region. We'll visit the famous *Cahills Crossing in search of crocodiles at this eye-opening stretch of water, the only road access point between Arnhem Land and Kakadu National Park. Visit the home to some of the oldest and best-preserved rock art galleries in the world, Ubirr rock, and marvel at the amazing rock formations of the East Alligator region of Kakadu as it meets the West Arnhem plateau. Depending on the seasonality and accessibility to Ubirr during the summer months, we may instead visit Kakadu's other main rock art attraction at Nourlangies rock, traditionally also known as Burrungkuy,. Where we can marvel at the art along the shaded rock shelters, appreciate the birdlife and hope to catch a glimpse of a number of species found nowwhere else on the planet.



Day Trips: Bring refillable water bottle, hat, sunscreen, sunglasses, windbreaker, walking shoes, camera, binoculars, money for food & beverages on your tour.
